

A Bill to Require Registration of Women for the Draft

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

SECTION 1. The United States shall require women aged 18 through 25 who live in the United States to register for the Selective Service.

SECTION 2. For the benefit of the legislation:

- A. Selective Service is the process by which the U.S. government collects names and addresses of men aged 18 through 25 to use in case a national emergency requires rapid expansion of the Armed Forces.
- B. Noncompliance is failure to act in accordance with a wish or command.

SECTION 3. The United States Selective Service System (SSS) shall oversee the enforcement of this legislation. The SSS shall require women to be subject to the requirements of this section and considered equally liable to register for the Selective Service and shall be subject to the same rules, obligations, and penalties for noncompliance.

SECTION 4. The Secretary of Defense in cooperation with the Selective Service shall issue regulations necessary to implement these changes within 180 days of the enactment of this Act.

SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
